This document constitutes the Pricing Supplement relating to the issue of the Notes described herein. This Pricing Supplement must be read in conjunction with the Offering Circular dated 29 June 2018 and the supplements to the Offering Circular dated 12 September 2018, 10 October 2018, 8 November 2018, 18 February 2019, 21 March 2019 and 17 May 2019 (together the "**Offering Circular**"). Full information on the Issuer, the Guarantor and the offer of the Notes is only available on the basis of the combination of this Pricing Supplement and the Offering Circular. Copies of the Offering Circular are available from the offices of Morgan Stanley & Co. International plc at 25 Cabot Square, Canary Wharf, London, E14 4QA. The Offering Circular has also been published on the website of the Euronext Dublin (www.ise.ie) and the Luxembourg Stock Exchange (www.bourse.lu).

Information Concerning Investment Risk

Noteholders and prospective purchasers of Notes should ensure that they understand the nature of the Notes and the extent of their exposure to risk and that they consider the suitability of the Notes as an investment in the light of their own circumstances and financial condition. The amount payable on redemption of the Notes is linked to the performance of the Underlying (as defined herein), and may be less than par. Given the highly specialised nature of these Notes, Morgan Stanley B.V. (the "Issuer"), Morgan Stanley ("the Guarantor") and Morgan Stanley & Co. International plc ("MSI plc") consider that they are only suitable for highly sophisticated investors who are able to determine for themselves the risk of an investment linked to the Underlying, are willing to take risks and can absorb the partial loss of their initial investment. Consequently, if you are not an investor who falls within the description above you should not consider purchasing these Notes without taking detailed advice from a specialised professional adviser.

Potential investors are urged to consult with their legal, regulatory, investment, accounting, tax and other advisors with regard to any proposed or actual investment in these Notes. Please see the Offering Circular together with the Pricing Supplement for a full detailed description of the Notes and in particular, please review the Risk Factors associated with these Notes. Investing in the Notes entails certain risks including, but not limited to, the following:

Adjustments by the Determination Agent: The terms and conditions of the Notes will allow the Determination Agent to make adjustments or take any other appropriate action if circumstances occur where the Notes or any exchanges are affected by market disruption, adjustment events or circumstances affecting normal activities.

In addition, other circumstances may occur which either increase the liability of the Issuer fulfilling its obligations under the Notes or increase the liability of any hedging activities related to such obligations, including without limitation the adoption of or any change in any tax law relating to a common system of financial transaction tax in the European Union or otherwise.

Potential investors should see the Offering Circular for a detailed description of potential adjustment events and adjustments.

In such circumstances, the Determination Agent can in its sole and absolute discretion determine whether to redeem the Notes early, or adjust the terms of the Notes, which may include without limitation adjustments to the Initial Reference Price, the Final Redemption Amount or the Underlying. The Determination Agent is not required but has the discretion to make adjustments with respect to each and every corporate action. Potential investors should see the Offering Circular for a detailed description of potential adjustment events and adjustments.

Administrator/Benchmark Event: The administrator or sponsor of an Underlying (or the Underlying itself) may be required to be authorised, registered, recognised, endorsed, the subject of an equivalence decision, approved or otherwise included in an official register in order for the Issuer or the Determination Agent to be permitted to use it and perform their respective obligations under the Notes. If the Determination Agent determines that such a requirement applies to the administrator or sponsor (or the Underlying) but it has not been satisfied then an "Administrator/Benchmark Event" will occur and the Determination Agent or the Issuer may then apply certain fallbacks. These fallbacks may mean that the Determination Agent makes adjustments to the terms of the Notes, including substitution of the relevant Underlying with the 'Alternative Pre-nominated Index' (if any) specified for the Underlying, or to redeem the Notes.

Potential investors should see the Offering Circular for a detailed description of what constitutes an Administrator/Benchmark Event and the applicable 'fallback' provisions that may apply if such event occurs.

Reform of LIBOR and EURIBOR and Other Interest Rate Index and Equity, Commodity and Foreign Exchange Rate Index "Benchmarks"

The London Interbank Offered Rate ("LIBOR"), the Euro Interbank Offered Rate ("EURIBOR") and other indices which are deemed "benchmarks" are the subject of recent national, international and other regulatory guidance and proposals for reform. Some of these reforms are already effective while others are still to be implemented. These reforms may cause such "benchmarks" to perform differently than in the past, or to disappear entirely, or have other consequences which cannot be predicted. Any such consequence could have a material adverse effect on any Program Securities linked to a "benchmark."

Any of the international, national or other proposals for reform or the general increased regulatory scrutiny of “benchmarks” could increase the costs and risks of administering or otherwise participating in the setting of a “benchmark” and complying with any such regulations or requirements. Such factors may have the effect of discouraging market participants from continuing to administer or participate in certain “benchmarks,” trigger changes in the rules or methodologies used in certain “benchmarks” or lead to the disappearance of certain “benchmarks”. The disappearance of a “benchmark” or changes in the manner of administration of a “benchmark” could have materially adverse consequences in relation to securities linked to such “benchmark”.

Expected replacement of London Interbank Offered Rate and replacement or reform of other interest rates could adversely affect our business, financial condition and results of operations

Central banks around the world, including the Federal Reserve, have commissioned working groups of market participants and official sector representatives with the goal of finding suitable replacements for LIBOR and replacements or reforms of other interest rate benchmarks, such as EURIBOR and EONIA. It is expected that a transition away from the widespread use of such rates to alternative rates based on observable market transactions and other potential interest rate benchmark reforms will occur over the course of the next few years. For example, the Financial Conduct Authority, which regulates LIBOR, has announced that it has commitments from panel banks to continue to contribute to LIBOR through the end of 2021, but that it will not use its powers to compel contributions beyond such date. Accordingly, there is considerable uncertainty regarding the publication of LIBOR beyond 2021.

On April 3, 2018, the Federal Reserve Bank of New York commenced publication of three reference rates based on overnight U.S. Treasury repurchase agreement transactions, including the Secured Overnight Financing Rate, which has been recommended as an alternative to United States dollar LIBOR by the Alternative Reference Rates Committee. Further, the Bank of England is publishing a reformed Sterling Overnight Index Average, comprised of a broader set of overnight Sterling money market transactions, which has been selected by the Working Group on Sterling Risk-Free Reference Rates as the alternative rate to Sterling LIBOR. Central bank-sponsored committees in other jurisdictions, including Europe, Japan and Switzerland, have, or are expected to, select alternative reference rates denominated in other currencies.

The market transition away from IBORs to alternative reference rates is complex and could have a range of adverse impacts on Morgan Stanley’s business, financial condition and results of operations. In particular, any such transition or reform could:

- Adversely impact the pricing, liquidity, value of, return on and trading for a broad array of financial products, including any IBOR-linked securities, loans and derivatives that are included in Morgan Stanley’s financial assets and liabilities;
- Require extensive changes to documentation that governs or references IBOR or IBOR-based products, including, for example, pursuant to time-consuming renegotiations of existing documentation to modify the terms of outstanding securities and related hedging transactions;
- Result in inquiries or other actions from regulators in respect of Morgan Stanley’s preparation and readiness for the replacement of IBOR with one or more alternative reference rates;
- Result in disputes, litigation or other actions with counterparties regarding the interpretation and enforceability of provisions in IBOR-based products such as fallback language or other related provisions, including in the case of fallbacks to the alternative reference rates, any economic, legal, operational or other impact resulting from the fundamental differences between the IBORs and the various alternative reference rates;
- Require the transition and/or development of appropriate systems and analytics to effectively transition our risk management processes from IBOR-based products to those based on one or more alternative reference rates in a timely manner, including by quantifying value and risk for various alternative reference rates, which may prove challenging given the limited history of the proposed alternative reference rates; and cause Morgan Stanley to incur additional costs in relation to any of the above factors.

Depending on several factors including those set forth above, Morgan Stanley's business, financial condition and results of operations could be materially adversely impacted by the market transition or reform of certain benchmarks. Other factors include the pace of the transition to replacement or reformed rates, the specific terms and parameters for and market acceptance of any alternative reference rate, prices of and the liquidity of trading markets for products based on alternative reference rates, and our ability to transition and develop appropriate systems and analytics for one or more alternative reference rates.

LIBOR, EURIBOR and other benchmark rate discontinuance or prohibition on use may lead to adjustments to the terms of the Notes or an early redemption of the Notes

As the Notes are denominated in U.S. Dollars and the Underlying is LIBOR, the fallback provisions will be triggered if the Issuer or its designee determines that (i) the administrator or regulatory supervisor (or other applicable regulatory body) in connection with Benchmark announces that the administrator has ceased or will cease permanently or indefinitely to provide such Benchmark and there is no successor administrator that will continue to provide the Benchmark, or (ii) the regulatory supervisor for the administrator of the Benchmark announces that the Benchmark is no longer representative. The occurrence of any of these events as determined by the Issuer or its designee shall constitute a "Benchmark Transition Event".

Following the occurrence of a Benchmark Transition Event, the Underlying will be replaced with an "Interpolated Benchmark" which is determined by the interpolation of such Benchmark insofar as this can be determined by the Issuer or its designee, or otherwise an alternative rate as set forth in (Benchmark Fallbacks (Effect of Benchmark Transition Event)) of this Term Sheet. If an Interpolated Benchmark or other alternative rate is used the Issuer or its designee may also make other adjustments to the Notes, including to the new rate and to the timing and frequency of determining rates and making payments of interest that the Issuer or its designee decides may be appropriate in a manner substantially consistent with market practice.

The application of any of these fallbacks may adversely affect the value of the Noteholder's investment in the Notes.

Adjustment and Discontinuation Risk: The Sponsor of the Underlying can add, delete or substitute stocks constituting the Underlying or make other methodological changes that could change the value of the Underlying without regard to the interests of holders of the Notes. Any of these decisions/determinations may adversely affect the value of the Notes and may result in the investor receiving a return that is materially different from what he/she would have received if the event had not occurred.

Product Market Risk: The value of the Notes and the returns available under the terms of the Notes will be influenced and dependent on the value of the Underlying. It is impossible to predict how the level of the Underlying will vary over time. The historical performance (if any) of the Underlying is not indicative of its future performance.

Credit Risk: Investors are exposed to the credit risk of the Issuer and/or Guarantor. The Notes are essentially a loan to the Issuer with a repayment amount linked to the performance of the Underlying that the Issuer promises to pay at maturity and that the Guarantor promises to pay if the Issuer fails to do so. There is the risk, however, that the Issuer and the Guarantor may not be able to fulfil their obligations, irrespective of whether the Notes are referred to as capital or principal protected. Investors may lose all or part of their investment if the Issuer and the Guarantor are unable to pay the coupons (if any) or the redemption amount. No assets of the Issuer and/or Guarantor are segregated and specifically set aside in order to pay the holders of the Notes in the event of liquidation of the Issuer and/or Guarantor, and the holders of the Notes will rank behind secured or preferred creditors.

Capital is not protected: the final redemption amount depends on the performance of the Underlying and could be zero.

Exit Risk: Any secondary market price of the Notes will depend on many factors, including the value and volatility of the Underlying(s), interest rates, time remaining to maturity and the creditworthiness of the Issuer and/or the Guarantor. The secondary market price may be lower than the market value of the issued Notes as at the Issue Date to take into account amounts paid distributors and other intermediaries relating to the issue and sale of the Notes as well as amounts relating to the hedging of the Issuer's obligations. As a result of all of

these factors, the holder may receive an amount in the secondary market which may be less than the then intrinsic market value of the Note and which may also be less than the amount the holder would have received had the holder held the Note through to maturity.

Liquidity Risk: The Notes will not be traded on an organized exchange. Any secondary market in the Notes made by the Dealer will be made on a reasonable efforts basis only and subject to market conditions, law, regulation and internal policy. Even whilst there may be a secondary market in the Notes it may not be liquid enough to facilitate a sale by the holder.

Hedging Risk: On or prior to and after the Trade Date, the Issuer, through its affiliates or others, will likely hedge its anticipated exposure under the Notes by taking positions in the Underlying, in option contracts on the Underlying or positions in any other available securities or instruments. In addition, the Issuer and its affiliates trade the Underlying as part of their general businesses. Any of these activities could potentially affect the value of the Underlying, and accordingly, could affect the pay-out to holders on the Notes.

No Shareholder Rights: A holder of Notes will have no beneficial interest in the stocks that compose the relevant Underlying nor any voting rights and will not have the right to receive dividends or other distributions with respect to the stocks that compose the Underlying.

Potential Conflict of Interest: The Determination Agent, which is an affiliate of the Issuer, will determine the pay-out to the investor at maturity. Morgan Stanley & Co. International plc and its affiliates may trade the Underlying on a regular basis as part of its general broker-dealer business and may also carry out hedging activities in relation to the Notes. Any of these activities could influence the Determination Agent's determination of adjustments made to any Notes and any such trading activity could potentially affect the price of the Underlying and, accordingly, could affect the investor's pay-out on any Note.

Underlying Sponsor Risk: The sponsor of the relevant Underlying is not an affiliate of the Issuer or its affiliates and is not involved with this offering in any way. Consequently, the Issuer and the Determination Agent have no ability to control the actions of the sponsor of the relevant Underlying, including and rebalancing that could trigger an adjustment to the terms of the Notes by the Determination Agent.

In purchasing any Notes, purchasers will be deemed to represent and undertake to the Issuer, the Dealer and each of their affiliates that (i) such purchaser understands the risks and potential consequences associated with the purchase of the Notes, (ii) that such purchaser has consulted with its own legal, regulatory, investment, accounting, tax and other advisers to extent it believes is appropriate to assist it in understanding and evaluating the risks involved in, and the consequences of, purchasing the Notes and (iii) in accordance with the terms set out in Annex 2.



Such recognition will depend upon the ECB being satisfied that Eurosystem eligibility criteria have been met.

5. **POTENTIAL SECTION 871(m) TRANSACTION** The Issuer has determined that the Notes should not be subject to withholding under Section 871(m) of the Code, and hereby instructs its agents and withholding agents that no withholding is required, unless such agent or withholding agent knows or has reason to know otherwise.
